STEW

addresses the tensions and congruities that exist between art

objects, their context, and a particular moment in time. The chosen works of art are emblematic of various strategies in art-making that in relation to one another force agitated conjugations. To counteract tendencies toward hierarchical or cohesive categorizations, STEW intentionally overloads the relationships between the works, allowing for independent readings or unexpected connections to be made.

STEW is the result of our search for intersections between our disparate visions, in order to find an adequate curatorial structure on which to examine the contemporary state of art. We initiated a malleable game of consensual and dictatorial methods (not withholding dissenting opinions) which forced interactions between varied curatorial premises and actual objects.

STEW is a celebration of collisions... a sutured collection of objects which will coalesce for only a brief time. Whether or not certain works of art will be bruised in this context remains to be seen.
