DESCRIPTION: Doug Ischar and Silvia Malagrino, assistant professors of art and design at UIC, have selected work by more than a dozen artists who share the goal of resistance to colonialism. While the Americas serve as the geographic heart of "DisOrient," much of the exhibition focuses elsewhere in the world. The works cover a wide range of colonizing activities, both present and historical. Artists featured in the exhibition include Laura Aguilar, who explores the conflicting roles she must play as a Latina lesbian living in Southern California, and Indian-British photographer Sunil Gupta, who examines the cultural denial and political oppression of gay men in contemporary India.
